“Requirements from the user’s perspective” (Chapter 2)

1. For each of the following, indicate if this belongs in the elicitation, analysis, specification, validation or management phase.
 - a. Reviewing the documented requirements to correct any problems before the development group accepts them
 - b. Translating the collected user needs into written requirements and diagrams suitable for comprehension, review, and use by their intended audiences
 - c. Keeping project plans current with the requirements as they evolve
 - d. Understanding user tasks and goals and the business objectives with which those tasks align
 - e. Decomposing high-level requirements into an appropriate level of detail
 - f. Negotiating new commitments based on the estimated impact of requirements changes
 - g. Tracing individual requirements to their corresponding designs, source code, and tests
 - h. Deriving functional requirements from other requirements information
 - i. Negotiating implementation priorities
 - j. Identifying the product’s expected user classes and other stakeholders
