

## Software Maintenance, ESOF 326, Spring 2019

### Explanation of Percentages

A percentage can represent the percentage of students who performed at 70% or higher, for a given assessment. However, usually percentage scores represent average scores from several offerings. In these averages, offering scores weigh equally, regardless of the number of students in the offering.

#### **Overview Outcome Report**

Semesters in the given range appear across the top; outcomes appear down the left side. Percentages correspond to a given semester/outcome.

A blank in the table indicates that no offering measured the outcome in that semester. Percentages are the average of the scores for all offerings that measured the outcome in the semester.

#### **Overview Course Report Error, the title just says “Course Report”**

Outcomes appear across the top; courses appear down the left side. Percentages correspond to a given outcome/course within the semester range.

A blank in the table indicates that the course does not measure the outcome. Percentages are the average of the scores for all offerings of the course that measured the outcome.

#### **C.O.R.E. Course Report**

This report corresponds to a course offering. The outcomes that the offering measures appear down the left side. The percentage of students in the offering who performed at 70% or higher on all assessments that measured that outcome appears next. Finally, the text of the outcome appears.

#### **Outcome Report**

This report corresponds to an outcome. Semesters in the given range appear across the top; those courses that measure this outcome appear down the left side. Percentages correspond to a given semester/courses for the outcome.

A blank in the table indicates that no offering of the course measured the outcome in that semester. **Error, a 0% appears instead of a blank.** Percentages are the average of the scores for all offerings of the course that measured the outcome in the semester.
